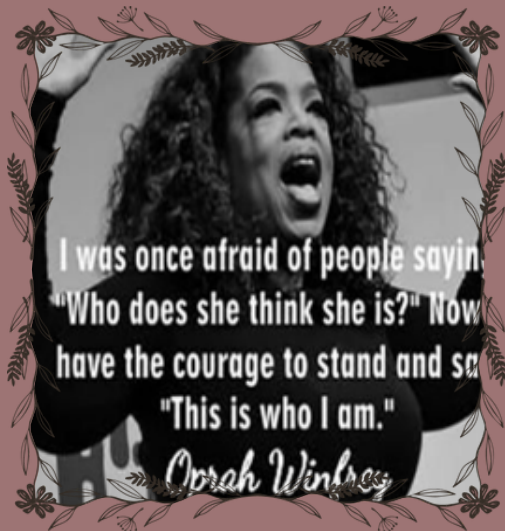

## DIACONATE MINISTRY

### Retirement of Deacon Jerdeline (Jeri) H. Swann



Deacon Jeri Swann has announced her retirement from active service as a Deacon at Shiloh Baptist Church (New Site). Deacon Swann was born and raised in Emporia, VA, the youngest girl of 13 children, and accepting Christ at an early age. She served actively at Paradise A.M.E. Zion Church (Lawrenceville, VA) until her family relocated to Spotsylvania, VA (1981), soon joining Little Mine Road Baptist Church. Deacon Swann joined the Shiloh New Site Family in 1995 and was ordained as a Deacon in 1998.

Deacon Swann has served faithfully in a variety of capacities at Shiloh New Site to include Stephen Minister, Sunday School teacher, member of the Board of Christian Education, Vacation Bible School teacher/volunteer, Prayer Ministry Leader, and member of various choirs.

Deacon Swann retired after nearly 40 years in the field of education, working with grades K-5 as a classroom and gifted resource teacher. Following her retirement from the school system, she worked as a receptionist at the Salvation Army, retiring during the pandemic. One of Deacon Swann's proudest professional moments was being named Spotsylvania County's division level Teacher of the Year. Deacon Swann is a member of Alpha Kappa Alpha Sorority, Inc. and most recently was recognized for 50 years of service with the Sorority.

# DIACONATE MINISTRY



## The Office of Deacon

When disputes arose in the early church alleging unequal treatment of a group of believers, the Apostles instructed the disciples to "choose seven men from among you who are known to be full of the Spirit and wisdom" to attend to the dispute so the Apostles could focus on ministering the Word to the people. From that experience came the office of deacon. Later, Paul specified deacons should be respected, sincere, abstain from excesses, not covetous, knowledgeable of the Word of God, tested to confirm their qualifications, faithful in marriage, and effective leaders of their own homes (1 Timothy 3:8-13).

Beyond these biblical standards, Shiloh New Site deacons are expected to be men and women (Shiloh New Site affirms that scripture supports the ordination of men and women) who regularly support the church in worship, study, and giving; evangelistic and missionary in spirit; discrete in matters requiring confidentiality; concerned about the salvation of souls home and abroad; apt to resolve conflicts and misunderstandings; and hold a reputation as good disciples of Jesus Christ.

The Shiloh New Site Constitution assigns deacons the following duties:

- 1) assist the Pastor in caring for the spiritual interests of the Church, administering the ordinances (Lord's Supper and Baptism) and direction of worship services,
- 2) supply the pulpit with ministers and speakers when the office of Pastor is vacant,
- 3) interview and recommend new candidates for membership,
- 4) make regular visitations to the membership, especially the sick, needy, and distressed, and
- 5) support the Church Clerk in the maintenance of the membership rolls.

Acts 6 instructed disciples to "choose men (and women) from among you" to serve as Deacons. In that spirit, the Shiloh New Site Church Family is encouraged to identify members who the Spirit leads them to nominate to the office of Deacon. Nominations should be forwarded to the Diaconate Chair (Nathaniel Harley at [nharleyjr06@gmail.com](mailto:nharleyjr06@gmail.com) / 540-226-5088) or the Diaconate Vice-Chair (Mary Tyson at [mabtyson@verizon.net](mailto:mabtyson@verizon.net) / 540-207-2782). Nominations will be prayerfully reviewed by the Diaconate and presented to the Pastor for his concurrence. Once vetted through that process, candidates will be notified of their nomination and asked to confirm in prayer whether they have been called to be a Deacon. Candidates who confirm a call to serve as Deacons will be presented for a church vote and then undergo a minimum of six months training before being ordained.





## Time Brings About a Change

For we know that when this earthly tent we live in is taken down (that is, when we die and leave this earthly body), we will have a house in heaven, an eternal body made for us by God himself and not by human hands. We grow weary in our present bodies, and we long to put on our heavenly bodies like new clothing. For we will put on heavenly bodies; we will not be spirits without bodies. While we live in these earthly bodies, we groan and sigh, but it's not that we want to die and get rid of these bodies that clothe us. Rather, we want to put on our new bodies so that these dying bodies will be swallowed up by life. God himself has prepared us for this, and as a guarantee he has given us his Holy Spirit. 2

Corinthians 5:1-5 (NLT)

A friend of my Mom's used to always say "time brings about a change". As I have grown older, I have found this to be so true. Until we receive our new bodies, we need to continue to take care of these earthly bodies we have been given and adapt to the changes that are taking place. Of course we know that being a couch potato will cause you to reap what you sow (i.e., if you're not active, your body will suffer with various illnesses, diseases, and decline), but there are other things that can and should be addressed to remain sociable and continue to bear fruit for the Kingdom.

The first issue is hearing loss. If you are missing out on parts or all of conversations or if you're the only one who can't hear the television at what everyone else deems to be a comfortable audible level, please get your hearing checked by a specialist (i.e., an otolaryngologist who is also called an ear, nose, and throat (ENT) doctor) or an audiologist. If hearing loss is the only issue and it's not associated with other symptoms such as pain, then an audiologist should be able to assess your hearing loss and assist you in correcting it. Most hearing aids these days are almost invisible and the sound can be adjusted with a cell phone app. This coverage is not covered by Medicare, but some employee health care packages and Medicare Advantage plans do cover a portion of the cost. Don't lose out on the precious gift of hearing the voices of your spouse, other family members, and friends. When you're witnessing for the Lord, don't you want to hear someone's response to the Gospel Message? Drop the pride and get your hearing checked!

The second issue is sight loss. As we age, vision issues will undoubtedly arise. In the United States, the leading causes of blindness and low vision are generally due to eye diseases such as age-related macular degeneration, cataract, diabetic retinopathy, and glaucoma. Original Medicare doesn't cover routine eye exams, but a simple vision test is included in your "Welcome to Medicare" preventive visit when you are first eligible for Medicare. Most employee health care packages and Medicare Advantage plans include coverage for an annual routine eye exam as well as all or part of the cost of eyeglasses. Jesus is the light that takes us out of spiritual darkness. Physical blindness can be avoided when you take the necessary steps to correct it before other health issues arise. The window of opportunity to take care of this issue can close, so pray on any solution given to you for correction.

As the scripture states above, our bodies long to be rid of this flesh so that we can receive our heavenly bodies, but until then, take care of what you have been given to the Glory of God!

**SUNDAY SCHOOL SPRING QUARTER SNEAK PREVIEW**

The title of the spring quarter's study is "Examining Our Faith."

In this study, we will explore the fullness of faith as a response to God's desire to be in relationship with us. To be "faithless" is to turn away from God—to put trust in something (or someone) other than God. The lessons for this quarter ask these question: Is your faith steadfast? Are you contending for the faith? In the Old and New Testaments, there are as many examples of spiritual fidelity as there are examples of spiritual infidelity. What can today's Christians draw from these ancient accounts that will help us grow more deeply in faith? The lessons of this quarter guide us to a reaffirmation of our confidence in God—because without faith it is impossible to please Him.

March : "Faith-FULL versus Faith-LESS," consist of five lessons drawn from the books of Jude, 2 Corinthians, 1 Peter, Acts, and Mark that invite us to turn the challenges of life into opportunities for nurturing a vibrant faith instead of giving up, turning away from God, or rejecting faith.

April: "The Measure of Faith," has four lessons drawn from the books of Luke and Matthew to discuss the range of Christian faith.

May: "Standing in the Faith," has four lessons drawn from the book of Romans that encourage believers to continue standing in the faith.

# Guide to Holy Week



## Palm Sunday

March 24

Sunday before Easter. Celebration of Jesus' triumphal entry into Jerusalem. Observed with palm branches, parades, and celebration.



## Maundy Thursday

March 28

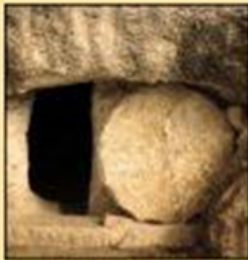
Thursday before Easter. Commemorates the Last Supper. Often observed with foot washing, stripping of the altar, and overnight prayer vigil to keep watch with Jesus in the garden.



## Good Friday

March 29

Friday before Easter. Most solemn day of the church year. Observes the day Jesus was crucified. Observed by praying the Stations of the Cross and three hours of silent prayer while Jesus was on the cross.



## Holy Saturday

March 30

Saturday before Easter. Observes the day Jesus was in the tomb. This is a day of somber reflection, reflecting on what we'd miss in a world without Jesus.



## Easter Sunday

March 31

Hallelujah! Christ has risen! This day we celebrate the resurrection of Jesus. Sing hallelujahs and celebrate with great joy.
