## Reverend Keenan E. L. Thomas, M. Div Pastor-Elect, Shiloh Baptist Church (New Site) Fredericksburg, VA




As a long-time resident of Central New Jersey, Rev. Keenan Thomas knows God is the source of his strength and God is the strength of his life. In 2008, Keenan graduated from Howard University in Washington D.C., with a Bachelor of Arts Degree in Telecommunications Management. Upon graduation, he began a four-year career in media sales at Katz Media Group in New York City. Keenan heard God's call to the gospel ministry in May of 2011. In May of 2015, he successfully obtained his Master of Divinity degree from Drew Theological Seminary in Madison, NJ.

Rev. Keenan served three years at Shiloh Baptist Church in Plainfield, NJ during seminary; his father, Rev. Gerald Lamont Thomas, served as senior pastor. He then served as a full-time staff pastor at First Baptist Church of Lincoln Gardens in Somerset, NJ from June 2015 to May 2019 under Rev. Dr. DeForest B. Soaries Jr. He was employed at Alfred Street Baptist Church in Alexandria, VA in ministry operations for two years. In October 2022, he became the pastor-elect of Shiloh Baptist Church (New Site) in Fredericksburg, Virginia.

Rev. Keenan's foundational scripture for new covenant ministry is found in 1 Peter 4:11, "If anyone speaks, they should do so as one who speaks the very words of God. If anyone serves, they should do so with the strength God provides..." Keenan is recently engaged to Shannon Wilson of Baltimore, Maryland. Outside of ministry, you can find Keenan engaging and enjoying God's most treasured creation – people.

(Rev. Keenan will begin service as full-time pastor on January 1, 2023 and will be formally installed as pastor on May 20, 2023.)

## Finally, Good News! Deacon Nathaniel Harley

"For thus says the LORD of hosts, the God of Israel: Do not let the prophets and the diviners who are among you deceive you, and do not listen to the dreams that they dream, for it is a lie that they are prophesying to you in my name; I did not send them, says the LORD. To For thus says the LORD: Only when Babylon's seventy years are completed will I visit you, and I will fulfill to you my promise and bring you back to this place."—Jeremiah 29:4-10

"I have good news and bad news. Which do you want first?" Many opt for the good news first, perhaps because we gravitate to the good things in life. Yet, bad news is always present, trying to fill us with doubt, worry, and fear. Just watch the evening news. The news anchor starts the broadcast with the most horrific news of the day. Then the anchor ends the broadcast on a good note as if to say, "Finally, I have good news!" Like that news anchor, the prophet Jeremiah had a duty to report the news, bad news: The Babylonian captivity would last 70 years.

When a report is not to our liking, we want a second opinion. If you have ever received a bad medical diagnosis, likely, you wisely sought a second opinion. The people of Judah were no different. But instead of reporting the truth, false prophets accommodated the people's desire for good news. One "prophet," Hananiah, offered his second opinion, that the captivity would end in two years. Jeremiah gave a second opinion also, confirmation that the Babylonian captivity would be for the full 70 years, just as God had said.

Like bad news, fake good news travels fast. False prophets in Babylon also encouraged the exiles to believe an early release was imminent. In response, Jeremiah issued a sobering letter to the exiles to set the record straight: Build houses, plant gardens, marry, have children and grandchildren, and pray for the peace of Babylon because you will be there for 70 years. Not exactly the news the people wanted to hear. But Jeremiah had more news for the exiles:

"11 For surely, I know the plans I have for you, says the LORD, plans for your welfare and not for harm, to give you a future with hope. 12 Then when you call upon me and come and pray to me, I will hear you. 13 When you search for me, you will find me; if you seek me with all your heart, 14 I will let you find me, says the LORD, and I will restore your fortunes and gather you from all the nations and all the places where I have driven you, says the LORD, and I will bring you back to the place from which I sent you into exile."—Jeremiah 29:11-14

Like that news anchor at the end of the broadcast, Jeremiah had some good news to report, finally. God had not abandoned the exiles, in fact they were the object of God's affections for a peaceful, hopeful future and divine restoration. The bad news in our lives is never the end of our story, only a snapshot in time. When you hear bad news, remember God not only offers good news—that He loves you eternally, unconditionally, and exclusively; He IS the Good News!






In many cultures the circle is a symbol of eternity, having no beginning and no end. The wreath combines evergreen boughs in a circle as a symbol of never ending love.
