


Looking Forward

*“...Forgetting what lies behind and straining forward to what lies ahead, ¹⁴ I press on toward the goal, toward the prize of the heavenly call of God in Christ Jesus.”—
Philippians 3:13-14*

Leaving the comfort of the known and trusted for the unknown and untested can be unnerving, even intimidating. That applies to a geographical move from one location to another, as well as the move to a new space in our emotions. The transition to college life, the move to a new job, and the commencement of a new relationship are only a few of those transitional moments that are full of anxiety as well as excitement. While the past or present may be filled with challenges and difficulties, we can find ourselves comfortable with the known.

We come to today’s passage after Paul has recited the things that were originally positive in his life. But after coming to know Jesus, he found the pedigree and achievements he valued were nothing more than garbage. So, he committed to letting go of his past in order to achieve Christ. But he had to be willing to forget and let go of what he was in order to become what he was purposed to be. There is a reality in that concept of letting go that is a challenge for many of us. We, as my mother at times admonished me, “want our cake and eat it too.” We like the beautiful decorations of the cake, but we also want to taste the cake. We can’t have both so we find ourselves paralyzed trying to have both when only one is possible.

For a year now, we have prayed for a pastor to serve in this congregation. The Pastor Search Committee can now formally announce that we have gone from 72 individuals expressing interest in the Office of Pastor down to three finalists, amongst whom we believe includes the next pastor of this congregation. No candidate is perfect, but we are hopeful one is the right fit for Shiloh New Site. Our next steps include conducting formal background checks, querying their character references and other points of contact, examining their interaction with their current congregation, and conducting personal interviews of the candidates. Once all that is completed, the committee will nominate a candidate for the church’s consideration.

We are prayerfully moving closer to God answering our prayers. And when God does provide our next pastor, what do we do next? Obviously, we give thanks to God for answered prayer, and we welcome and embrace the new pastor. But we also find ourselves mindful of the things of our collective church past, but looking to a new pastor to chart a new course going forward. Some of the new course may include things we do currently or what we have done in the past. Other aspects of that new course may be truly “unchartered waters.” Certainly, we expect new leadership to follow the Word of God as well as seek input from the congregation they serve. But equally, we can expect them to do things as God leads them. At the same time, we recognize they will have a steep learning curve. Someone wisely noted that a new pastor coming to a congregation

is like a person walking into a theater midway through the movie. Most of the congregation knows the background to the scene, but the pastor is catching up on what he/she missed while trying to watch the rest of the movie.

As we move forward in anticipation of a new pastor, we are mindful of Paul's words, "forgetting what lies behind and straining forward to what lies ahead." We do not forget the lessons of the past, but we guard against being entrenched to the past. We remain open to new ways of looking at ourselves, our ministries, and our world. We allow space for the pastor to learn and grow in this new vineyard called Shiloh New Site. In order to see change, we must expect change. Some we will joyfully embrace; some we may need to discuss as a collective body. But we go forward together in the Spirit of the LORD and in a spirit of expectancy as we anticipate what God will do in this congregation!

Cystic Fibrosis Walk 2022

Healthcare Ministry

Information from the Health Care Ministry

This edition of the Health Care Ministry article will focus on the Flu, COVID 19, and Seasonal Allergies, and differentiate between the three. I term the three as being The Respiratory Tri-Issue of illnesses that many people contract yearly.

During the spring, **Seasonal Allergies** cause much discomfort for many as pollen counts are high and different allergens blow through the air causing symptoms such as: 1) Sneezing, 2) Watery eyes, 3) Runny nose, itchy nose, mouth, eyes, or skin; 4) Stuffy nose; 5) Coughing 6) Blocked and clogged ears; 7) Sore throat; 8) Headache; and 9) Feeling tired and irritable. Seasonal allergies may also be problematic for some during the summer and fall months, although not as bothersome as in the spring and are less likely to be experienced during the winter months.

Preventing and Treating Seasonal Allergies include: 1) Avoid your triggers- remain in-doors as much as possible and shower after exposure; 2) Keep windows closed; 3) Use an air purifier; 4) Take over the counter medications; 5) Rinse sinuses; 6) and Shower before bed. In addition, a visit to your health care provider may be helpful.

Influenza is a contagious viral infection that infects the nose, throat and lungs and may last three to four days. The viruses spread when people with the flu cough, sneeze or talk, sending droplets with the virus into the air and therefore into the nose and/or the mouth of other people nearby. The flu may be life threatening if left untreated.

The flu is also seasonal since most cases are during the fall and winter months when the weather is cold and drier. Also, people spend more time in doors and are more likely to spread the virus easily from one person to another. During the spring and summer months, the number of flu cases drop tremendously due to the fact that people spend more time outdoors and are not in close contact with each other. Symptoms of the flu include the following: 1) Fever/chills; 2) Cough; 3) Sore throat; 4) Runny or stuffy nose; 5) Muscle or body aches; and 6) Fatigue.

Treatment for the flu includes: 1) Rest; 2) Antiviral medications (Tamiflu); and 3) Drink lots of fluids. Prevention-- Stay away from people exhibiting signs/symptoms of respiratory infections.

Healthcare Ministry Cont.

COVID 19, although on the decline in many parts of the country, continues to be a major problem for many. The Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) has identified a BA.2 as a variant of the highly infectious Omicron variant that has caused hospitalizations and deaths of many including some in the State of Virginia. This variant is also highly contagious and easily transmissible.

Recent statistics show nearly three out of four new virus cases were identified as BA.2; the number of new cases has doubled according to the CDC. New cases of COVID are also going up across the country including Virginia.

Signs and symptoms of COVID 19 ARE: 1) Fever; 2) Sore throat; 3) Cough; 4) Malaise; 5) Muscle or body aches; 6) Headache; 7) Congestion; and 8) Nausea and vomiting.

Treatment actually is about prevention, which means getting vaccinated with the three shots. Two initial shots and a booster. For those who are immunocompromised, a second booster shot is recommended. We must continue to be vigilant, wear the mask, keep your distance of six feet from others when out and about and wash your hands frequently.

There are many similarities in the symptoms between the flu and COVID. If you have any of the above symptoms, it is best to get tested for COVID to make sure it is not COVID 19 but the flu instead and proceed to treat the flu as indicated. If you are tested positive for COVID 19, quarantine yourself for five days if asymptomatic. If you continue to have a fever, isolate yourself for another five days and take Tylenol for fever. Contact your health care provider for additional treatment.

“The Lord himself goes before you and will be with you; He will never leave you nor forsake you. Do not be afraid; do not be discouraged.” Deuteronomy 31:8 (NIV)

When you become a red, white, and blue card-carrying senior citizen, you will eventually become exposed to a variety of doctors. Cardiologists, ophthalmologists, endocrinologists, gastroenterologists, neurologists, oncologists, and a host of other “ologists”. When you’re sent to one of these specialists, it’s because your primary care physician has detected something during an exam that requires more testing and evaluation by a specialist. No one wants to hear their physician say that they see something that looks unsettling, and they definitely don’t want to hear the specialist say after additional testing that there is no lifestyle change, medication, or surgery that can correct your condition. Hopefully, you’ve been in prayer each day for God’s favor, but more importantly, for God’s Will to be done as Jesus prayed in the Model Prayer (Matthew 6:10) and in His prayer at Gethsemane (Matthew 26:39).

Medical reports are just like any other negative situation in life that blindsides us causing us to lose sight of Jesus Christ who is already in each believer’s boat (remember the story of the disciples in the midst of the storm in Matthew 8:23-27?) and has the power to calm any storm. We may not know God’s plan, but we do know His promises. Jesus promised that He would send us a Comforter (John 16:7). Therefore, hold firm to God’s promise that He will never leave us or abandon us. He’s always with us. Accept His peace despite the report. (John 14:27)

Memorial Day Tribute

On Memorial Day weekend, members of local Boy Scout and Girl Scout troops placed luminaries on the 15,000 graves of fallen soldiers at the Fredericksburg National Cemetery on Lafayette Boulevard. Traditionally, the luminaria takes place on the Saturday before Memorial Day.

The 27th Annual Luminaria was held on May 28, 2022, sponsored by the Friends of Wilderness Battlefield with the support of the National Park Service and the Scout volunteers.

Some of the Scouts come out early morning to lay out the white paper bags at each gravesite and along the pathways leading to the cemetery. They then place a plastic sandwich bag filled with sand in the paper bag and lastly center an unlit tea candle on the sandbag. Later in the evening, all of the tea candles are lit at the ceremony to honor those buried at the cemetery.

Cub Scout Pack 46 and their leaders assist with the layout of the candles each year. After completing their assigned section of rows, the reality of "why" sets in - to honor our heroes - some whom have been long forgotten.



At the end of Officers Row at the Fredericksburg National Cemetery is gravesite #10 of one hero familiar to Shiloh – First Lieutenant Urbane Bass, along with his wife Maude. Lt. Bass was the first African American commissioned officer buried in the National Cemetery. Bass was a graduate of Virginia Union University and Shaw University and moved to Fredericksburg in 1909. He served as Fredericksburg’s first black doctor until the outbreak of World War I.

Despite the continued existence of segregation, Dr. Bass offered his services for the Army Medical Corps. His service later cost him his life as he was struck by a shell which severed both of his legs. He was only 36 years of age when he died and was awarded the Distinguished Service Cross for administering first aid in open shell fire. Shiloh installed the large stained-glass window, incorporating Bass’ image in honor of his heroism. The Bass-Ellison Social Services Building on Jackson Street in Fredericksburg is also named partly in his honor.

Thank you, First Lieutenant Bass, for choosing to make a difference.

Below are some important dates that requires your action. That implies you must do something. That happens when we all do our part in every aspect of our lives, to include voting. Even if you don't vote in person, there are other options to have your voice heard. Early voting has already begun.

Jun 18, 2022	Last day of in-person early voting	Local Voter Registration Office
Jun 21, 2022	Party Primary	Voting Location




